#### How to pick the best instrument?

Fitting Meetings are important at helping students find the right instrument for them.

### How do you get an instrument?

- My top recommendation is to rent an instrument.
  - As a parent, I suggest a rental program that can give you a level of security.
    - Return the instrument when needed (no additional charge)
    - Repair and fix instrument when needed
    - Understand that you will have a quality instrument with NO issues
    - Parents can exchange an instrument if the kid switches
  - Music and Arts visits us once a week to bring supplies, repairs, etc.
  - Rental programs are a "rent to own" ranging from around \$30 60 a month.

# Why "Music and Arts?"

We have used this company for around 16 years. This group is at our school once a week. They provide good service, repairs, and supplies.

I highly recommend this company for your music needs. For a Song and a Story is a satellite store of Music and Arts.

# Other ways to get an instrument -

#### Borrow a used instrument from family and/or friend

 This is a wonderful way to get an instrument. My suggestion is still do a fitting meeting to double check. Also, bring in the used instrument and let us check it out and make sure it doesn't need repaired.

#### Purchase an instrument

 I don't recommend purchasing an instrument right away. If you do purchase an instrument, avoid "no-name" (check list) or online purchases. Lower prices normally = lower quality.

#### School Instruments

 I want everyone to participate in band. We have a set of "school owned" instruments available for kids in need. We can assign a student an instrument. The student is able to use the instrument for as long as they stay in band!
